Dilemma of Education Reform

Although, there are some improvements in current educational system, it still lacks a strong backbone. One of the major problems is the lack of sufficient government funding and resources to perform prospective educational reforms. Limited funding for production and publishing of new educational materials, including textbooks and supplements, greatly result in poor educational curricula and productivity; as a result all major educational resources come from old fashioned soviet system.

Credential Evaluation of Private Educational Institutions and approval of their programs according to international standards are crucial for the system to function appropriately and provide quality education. These countries need skilled experts and qualified international educational trainees to adopt and implement new ideas and innovative programs/tools to improve the educational system in these regions.
