Facts & Figures . . .

- More than 3.5 million individuals in the US (Buescher et al., 2014)
- New case is diagnosed every 20 minutes
- Estimated 1 in 68 children currently being diagnosed
- Possibly as high as 1 in 50 per parent report (2013)
- 1 in 54 in Utah
- 1 in 38 in South Korea
- In all countries and communities
- Boys are 5x more likely than girls
- Autism is the fastest growing developmental disability in the US
- In 2015, cost US \$268 billion, estimated to increase to \$461 billion by 2025 (Leigh & Du, 2015)
- could be as high as \$1 trillion
- ~ 2.3 million dollars to care for an individual with autism over their life span

What is Autism?

A developmental disorder characterized by marked difficulty in communication and social relations and by the presence of atypical behaviors such as unusual responses to sensation, repetitive movements, and insistence on routine or sameness.

- 3. Requiring very Substantial Support

Core areas that indicate a diagnosis of ASD:

- 1. Deficits in social communication
- 2. Repetitive, restricted interests
